Find your own music

We challenge you to get out of your comfort zone. Spark your imagination and encourage you to develop your own individual sound. That one style that makes you stand out and brings you recognition. That versatile musical idiom you use to set the tone. Playing jazz requires creativity. The ability to see beyond your own boundaries. To let go and then regain control. In lessons, but also during special theme days, workshops, projects, and masterclasses by internationally renowned guest lecturers, we explore styles, musicians or bands, rhythms and concepts.

Main subjects

The Jazz programme offers the following main subjects: Bass Guitar & Double Bass, Composing & Arranging, Electronic Music Performance, Drums & Percussion, Guitar, Piano, Saxophone, Trombone, Trumpet and Vocals. During your studies, (big) band playing will be at the centre of your artistic training and your individual learning and development process.

Jazz at Conservatorium Maastricht is jazz in the broadest sense of the word: classic jazz, bebop, hot, cool, swing, mainstream and all jazz-related styles such as Afro-Cuban, Latin, funk, R&B, fusion and crossover pop. Jazz is improvisation in any form. Composing, arranging, recording and producing are an important part of the programme. Currently, electronic musicians everywhere search for ways to include more live elements in their music. Jazz musicians explore the possibilities of electronic music.



Bachelor's degree

Your core curriculum (major) includes your main subject and band & performing, composing and arranging, recording and producing, as well as tools for creating your own music such as ear training and applied theory. Bands with a wide variety of styles, including big band, rehearse on a weekly basis under the supervision of a lecturer. During the band project weeks, students spend the whole week rehearsing with a lecturer and perform at festivals like the Jazz Night. The minor in teaching, with methodology, pedagogical subjects and a teaching internship, will prepare you for a career in music education!

Master's degree

The two-year internationally-oriented Master of Music serves the purpose of deepening your experience, practice and knowledge of jazz and beyond. Our approach focusses on experiment through practice-based and performance-based research connected to your main subject and your personal and professional goals in music. Building knowledge that will serve you being a musician, ready for our society of today.

The region

The international location of the Conservatorium (central in the Euregion) gives you countless opportunities to gain experience and attend concerts within the borders and beyond. Student bands play at different venues in Maastricht, the Netherlands, Belgium, Luxenburg and Germany.

In addition, this international character also attracts students from all over the world, each student bringing their own cultural and national background which contributes to an enriching learning experience.

Music Industry Network

We actively seeks out the relevant conferences, network events, festivals and competitions to directly present our students and alumni. Internationally we also support our students with (Erasmus) exchange programmes.
